This is in further reference to the discussion of Prof. Dr. GVR Sastry, Chairman – Coastal India Development Council (CIDC) with you yesterday regarding the establishment of Integrated Fishing Harbours across the huge coastline of the state of Gujarat.

Please find attached the sample format of the letter received from the state of Andhra Pradesh regarding the establishment of fishing harbours projects in Andhra Pradesh state. We required the letter from the Government of Gujarat in the same lines addressed to Shri Yaduvendra Mathur, IAS, Additional Secretary, NITI Aayog, Government of India, New Delhi.

We would like to mention that we are closely working with the NITI Aayog in regards to identify the suitable locations across our coastline for Integrated Fishing Harbours projects

and further establishment of the harbours in coordination with the respective state governments. The communication from NITI Aayog is attached herewith for your ready reference please.

Following the process, we have identified few locations in the state of Gujarat for the Integrated Fishing Harbour projects. The same are as mentioned below.

Location (1)	<i>Porbandar, Gujarat (River Mouth of Bhadar River)</i>
Location (2)	<i>Kutch, Gujarat, Near Pingleshwar Beach (River Mouth of Nayaro River)</i>
Location (3)	<i>Layja Nana Village, Mandvi Tehsil, Kutch District (River Mouth of Kharod River)</i>
Location (4)	<i>Junagadh, Gujarat (River Mouth of Vrajmi River)</i>
Location (5)	<i>Kosamba, Valsad, Gujarat (Joining point of River Wanki & River Auranga)</i>
Location (6)	<i>River Mouth location of river Narmada</i>

The reference of the above mentioned locations may be mentioned in the letter (same as mentioned in the Andhra Pradesh letter - attached).

Salient benefits of the Integrated Fishing Harbour Project:

- The projects will largely contribute to the overall inclusive growth of economy of the Nation
- It will improve the Supply-Chain management of the fisheries products
- It will be a platform governed by the state government for the trading of fisheries products without the intervention of any third (private) party
- The integrated fishing harbours will address the issues like storage, supply chain mechanism, marketing issues, wastage, processing units, trading, transportation etc. related to fisheries products across the huge coastline of the state of Gujarat
- Coastal Community Development
- Generation of huge Employment Opportunities
- There will be a huge change in the lifestyle of the local population
- The fishing harbour will use the high technology enabled fishing boats including Fish Processing facilities, Fish Processing centre and the Export center etc.
